One of her favourite joys was to receive a command performance of Ukrainian music. When Baba asked them to play, there was no turning her down. Anastasia was a deeply spiritual individual, and an example of Christian love. She was a long-standing member of Immaculate Conception Church, Cook's Creek, MB, where, over the years, she served on the Church Committee, the Ladies Committee, and as a volunteer donating countless hours.
