You would often find him in his basement watching the hockey game or sitting in his favourite spot listening to CJOB while reading the newspaper.

As a child, he attended Melrose School where he met Olly Krawec, and they were married August 12, 1961. Quinty and Olly had three children, Donna, Russell and Holly, whose photos he would keep in his wallet and proudly share with anyone who asked about them. He enjoyed spending time with his family, his nephew, nieces, sisters-in-law and brothers-in-law.

Quinty was always a provider for his family, and he did that very well. People say "jack-of-all-trades, master of none," but Quinty was a master of EVERYTHING. He worked as a mechanic, a drywaller, and worked for many years for Koreman Concrete. You could not tell Quinty about something being broken without him writing it down in the top of his cigarette pack and coming over moments later with a



truck full of supplies. He passed these skills on to his children and grandchildren who have a keen knack for creative fixing. He valued his relationships above all else and especially loved driving his black truck VERY SLOWLY to OakBank to have coffee with his friends, or down the road to have a Pepsi with his grandkids, Olivia, Russell, Aydin, Hudson and Dexter. A man of few words, Quinty still loved being a part of the action whether it be playing foosball, picking up tools and supplies someone dropped on the highway, or walking with his hands in his pockets, jingling his pocket change, at every event in Cooks Creek.
