Dad worked for Canada Post for 26 years retiring in 1986. After retiring Dad kept busy spending time with his children and grandchildren. He loved to fish and spend time working in his vegetable garden and flower gardens that were his pride and joy. Dad loved his pigeons and was well known in the area for raising and selling them.
